It's Time to Check back in with our Garlic!

There's not much to do in early spring for garlic but it's always fun to pull up the heavy winter mulch and see the new, sprouted plants.

When the snow melts and it starts getting warm, it is time to pull some of the mulch layer off the garlic bed. When you lift it up you should see small leaves, similar to daffodil leaves, coming up. You still want to use a layer of the mulch around the plants to keep the weeds down and help with water conservation.

The next event in the garlic cycle will be late May/June – depending on the weather, when the scapes will be ready. Stay tuned!

Using Your Mobile Device? Follow These Easy Steps!

- 1. Open up the Libby app on your tablet or phone.
- 2. If you are already signed in to Libby, click ADD LIBRARY under Your Libraries. Type "id:alookatlibby" into the search bar and hit the magnifying glass.
- 3. Select Sign In With My Card. You will need to sign-in with your mobile phone number. You will receive a confirmation code on your phone. Enter this code to confirm your phone number.
- 4. Please enter special campaign code: **0703SpringLibbyDemo22** to complete the sign-up process.
